St. Thomas makes free nonperishable food products available to the needy, both Catholic and non-Catholic.

PARISH INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY:

In the event of inclement weather, log on to www. ohiomuskingumsheriff.org and check the box at the top right of the page titled "Winter Emergency Level." If a Level 2 Snow Emergency is declared, the Parish Office will close and all church activities except for Mass will be cancelled. If a Level 1 Emergency is declared, the Parish Office remains open; the chairmen of individual activities will determine each group's status. Every attempt will be made to reach a decision as soon as possible.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Last weekend was the official kickoff to the Capital Campaign for the Renovation of St. Thomas Aquinas Church. We have waited and prayed for this day for almost four years and the time has now arrived. As I have shared with you previously, the first phase of this project was to "Save the Church physically." We did that in 2020, with the purchase and installation of shoring towers and scaffolding to support the roof until permanent repairs could be made. Let me assure you the church was stabilized by that action and remains stable during the current repair process.

The second phase of this project was to "Save the church canonically". We accomplished this goal working through the Real Presence, Real Future initiative throughout 2021 and 2022, culminating in the decision to repair St. Thomas Aquinas Church by Bishop Earl Fernandes and Pentecost of last year. Phase three of the project is the physical repair of the church and its opening. A team of up to 14 workers have been onsite most weekdays since October 16th when repairs began. We are well underway!

The time has come to discuss the financial needs of the Parish for our long-term sustainability as envisioned by Bishop Fernandes. That is where you, my fellow parishioners can have an impact on the future of St. Thomas Aquinas Church. The total cost of the project is \$2.1 million. It is the policy of the diocese that no project can start until all needed funds are either in hand or pledged for the project. In order to initiate repairs immediately, we transferred funds necessary for the repairs from our endowment to the diocesan Parish Activities Fund. The positive from this action is that we could start repairs immediately on October 16th. The downside from this action is that St. Thomas will not be able to recognize the income from the funds that were in the endowment. This will reduce our annual parish income by over \$100,000.00.

The funds raised from the Pride in Our Past, Faith in Our Future Campaign will be used to replenish the endowment, so that St. Thomas can continue to receive this \$100,000.00 annually as part of its operating income. St. Thomas Aquinas has received a grant from the Cora E. Rogge Foundation in the amount of \$250,000.00. This grant decreased the out-of-pocket cost from \$2.1 million to \$1,850,000.00. It is our plan to draw down another endowment by \$350,000.00. This leaves \$1.5 million that needs to be raised in the capital campaign to pay for the repairs.

On the tables exiting the church you will find pledge cards and flyers describing the project and asking for your financial commitment. We ask that you take a pledge card and consider a gift to the Capital Campaign. You can make a one-time donation or you can spread a pledge over the next three years to better meet your financial needs. You have three options for participating.

- Dropping off your donation or pledge card to the Parish Office.
- Mailing your donation or pledge to the Catholic Foundation in the envelopes provided.
- Dropping your donation or pledge card in the offertory basket at Mass.

We would prefer to receive your donation or pledge as soon as possible. No gift is too small as we work together to achieve this financial goal. As for the repairs, I will continue to keep you updated on a weekly basis in the bulletin as to how the project is proceeding. Please make sure to pick up a bulletin every week and I promise to keep you updated. I know you are anxious to know a date when we can reenter the church. Many factors come into play including subcontractors' scheduling and material lead-times. If I am pressed to give you a date, I am hopeful that the church will re-open in the summer of 2024. As the project proceeds, I will be able to predict an exact opening date more accurately. Please feel free to stop by or call the Parish office with any questions you may

Finally, I am sure you have noticed the steel structural members on sawhorses that have been set up in the Activity Center. These components will become part of the truss system of St. Thomas Aquinas Church. If you would like to sign the components, please feel free to do so with the sharpies provided. In this way, your name will be memorialized in perpetuity with the church. These components will remain available for signature throughout the month of January. May God bless you as you pray fully consider your participation in our capital campaign!

THERE'S STILL TIME TO GIVE:

Your gift to the 2023 Appeal is vital to the success of this diocesan-wide campaign and can benefit our parish. We are off to a good start toward our parish goal of \$57,761.29. As of January 3, 2024, we have collected \$57,675.79 and pledged \$60,465.00. Thank you to all those families that have made a gift or pledge. If we continue to make our pledge payments, we will be getting a refund back of \$2,789.21. If you have not yet made your gift to this year's Appeal, please consider doing so in the days ahead. The refund will be applied to our roof project.

ROOF REPAIR UPDATE

I am pleased to announce that the Cora E. Rogge Foundation has made a donation to St. Thomas Aquinas Church so that the four-sided clock in the bell tower can be replaced.

The current mechanical clock is nearly 100 years old and has been repaired on many occasions and currently does not work. Due to its age, it is now considered irreparable. The installation of a new clock was not part of the original plan and scope of work for the repair and renovation of the church, but the Foundation has generously donated \$25,000.00 so that the clock can be replaced as part of the church renovation. The Cora E. Rogge Foundation has previously provided a grant of \$250,000.00 for the repair and renovation of the church. Our community is truly blessed to have an organization such as this that provides support to the Catholic community of Muskingum County.

Our History Is Rooted in Dominican Teachings

St. Thomas Aquinas is rooted in the teachings of the Dominican Fathers. Parish life began in 1819 when the first Catholic Mass was celebrated by Fr. Dominick Young at the Green Tree Tavern. In 1820, John Dugan, the key benefactor of St. Thomas, purchased land at the corner of Fifth Street and Locust Alley upon which the first Catholic Church was built in Zanesville under the patronage of The Holy Trinity.

This new Catholic Church was the catalyst for Catholicism in Zanesville. A sandstone structure was built that stands today as the current St. Thomas Aquinas Church. St. Thomas has been serving the community since the cornerstone was laid on St. Patrick's Day in 1842. Dominican Fathers staffed St. Thomas until 2017, when the Catholic Diocese of Columbus accepted the property and assumed pastoral care.



Building The Future Of St. Thomas Aquinas

Phase 1: Saving St. Thomas Structurally

On Ash Wednesday 2020, St. Thomas closed due to issues associated with our roofing infrastructure. In order to reopen our beloved church, a plan to stabilize the roof was implemented.



Phase 2: Saving St. Thomas Canonically

St. Thomas faced two additional challenges: the COVID pandemic and the newly implemented Diocesan plan known as *Real Presence, Real Future*. During this time, the St. Thomas community rallied together and engaged in a variety of parish life activities in order to help overcome the void of not physically being inside the church. The fruits of our labor resulted in the final report of *Real Presence, Real Future* issued by Bishop Earl K. Fernandes in Spring 2023 that keeps St. Thomas Aquinas open.

Phase 3: Rebuilding St. Thomas

Despite all of the hardships faced over the past few years, membership at St. Thomas has grown by 10% since 2020. Today, nearly 600 families call St. Thomas their faith home. Plans are underway to not only repair the roof, but also preserve the beautiful, one-of-a-kind Gothic plaster ceiling inside the church. It is essential that all parish families participate in the financial act of stewardship to help with the structural restoration of St. Thomas. Please help us to re-enter our beautiful church!
