IN SYMPATHY:


James "Jim" Adornetto passed away on February 5th. Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon him.

ROOF REPAIR UPDATE

It has been over a month since the kickoff of the Capital Campaign for the repair and renovation of St. Thomas Aquinas Church. This week, we would like to provide information relative to our progress of meeting the \$1,500,000 campaign goal.

WE REACHED OUR GOAL:


"COME AND SEE" WEEKEND:

- It is estimated that one million people have insufficient food consumption and with survival taking precedence over education many primary school-age children drop out of school early.
