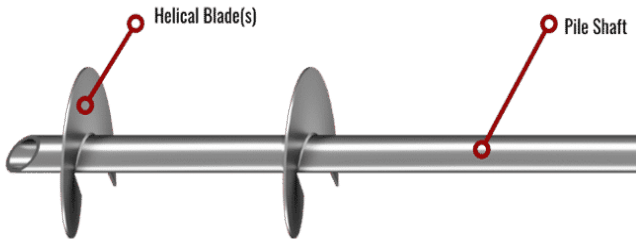

ROOF REPAIR UPDATE

This week, a new phase of the church repair begins in the alley behind the church. In order to stabilize the eastern foundation of the church, helical piles will be installed over the next six weeks. In the 1920s, a walkway was added to the church which allowed for access to the sacristy from a door located in the southern alley. That foundation has sunk a number of inches over the decades, creating stresses on both the trusses and the back wall of the church, which led to the cracking of the plaster above the stained-glass window. A helical pile is a deep foundation solution suitable for supporting heavy structures. A helical pile consists of a round steel shaft and one or more helical bearing blades which are welded to the shaft. The helical pile project should be completed by April 19.

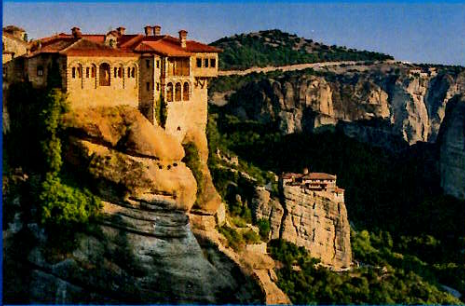

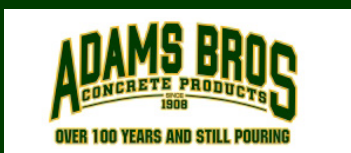

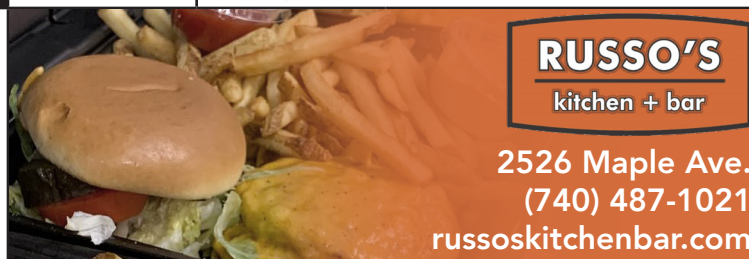
