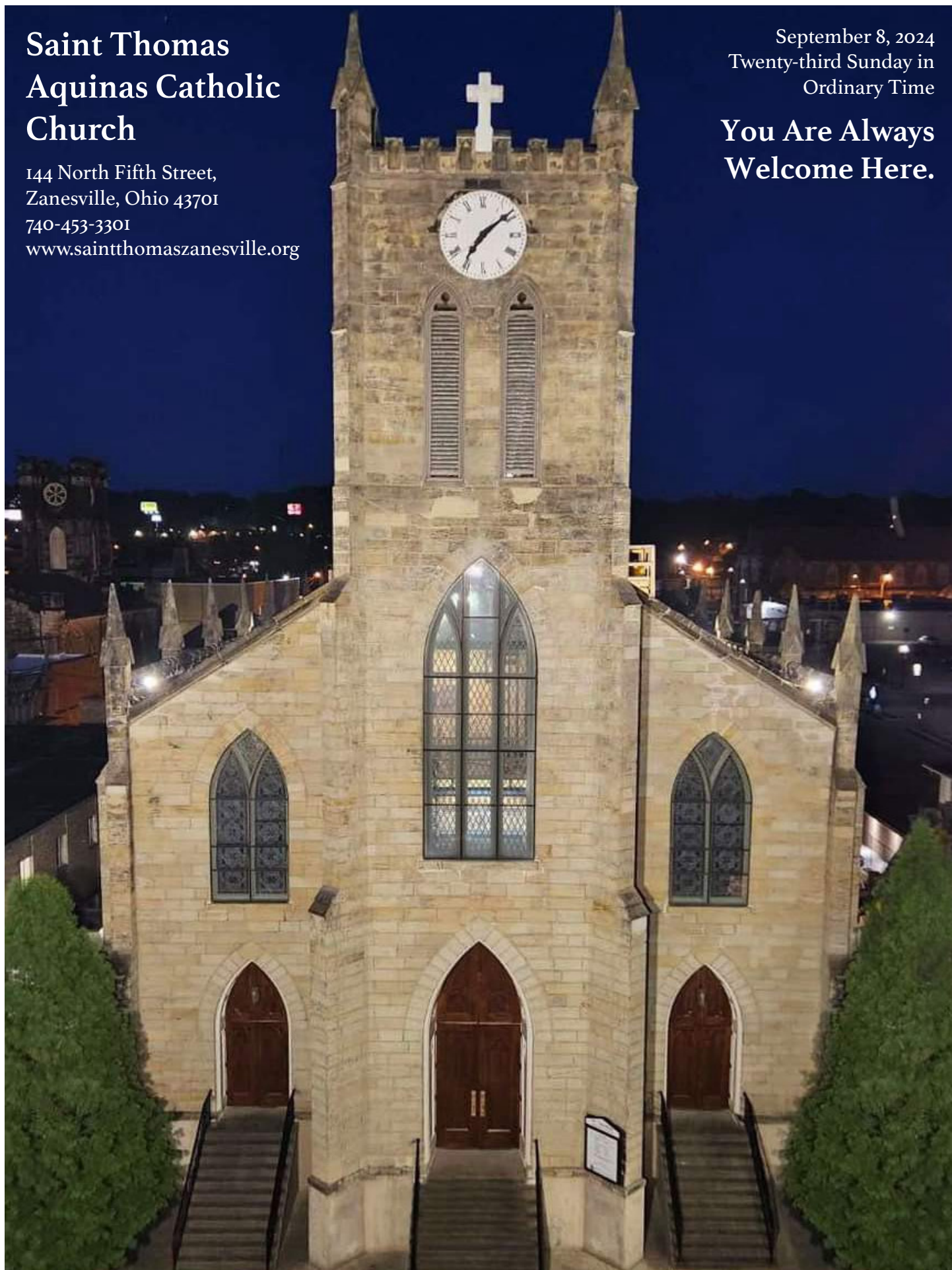

ST. THOMAS AQUINAS CHURCH FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

SEPTEMBER 8, 2024 – REOPENING MASS

WHY DID IT TAKE 4 ½ YEARS TO REPAIR AND RENOVATE THE CHURCH?

The church was originally closed due to problems with the roofing infrastructure on February 26, 2020. Approximately one month later, the world was struck by the Covid pandemic, leading to global lockdowns. This impacted plans to repair the church by approximately two years. The schedule was further compromised in 2023 when Bishop Robert Brennan was assigned to the Diocese of Brooklyn, New York. The Diocese of Columbus had no bishop for many months until Rev. Earl K. Fernandes was appointed by Pope Francis on April 2, 2022, and then consecrated our Bishop on May 31, 2022. Bishop Fernandes gave his approval to repair and renovate the church following his analysis of the plan for the future of the Diocese of Columbus in relation to the *Real Presence, Real Future* initiative.

WHO REPAIRED THE CHURCH?

There are many organizations and individuals that participated in the repair and renovation.

The general contractor was Corna Kokosing (CK). Subcontractors include: Martin Painting, Jones Schlater Flooring, Wayne Manufacturing, Freuh Engineering, Derwacter Engineering, Ratigan-Schottler, T. Brausch Studios, William Heyer Architects, Intertek, Peebles-Herzog, and Verdin.

WHAT WAS THE DESIGN INSPIRATION FOR THE NEW INTERIOR?

The design was focused on a combination of defining principles including both St. Thomas Aquinas and the Dominican history of the parish. For instance, the east wall of the sanctuary is distinguished by the numerous angels which surround the altar. We believe as Catholics that during Mass, the angels and the saints join with us around the altar. The decorative painting of Seraphim angels on the wall behind the altar proposes a vision into this mystical event. Above the tabernacle you will also find a re-creation of the famous 13th-century icon of the Crucifixion which hangs today within the cell of St. Thomas Aquinas. One December day in 1273, St. Thomas was praying before this icon (in the chapel of St. Nicholas, at the Church of San Domenico Maggiore) and had a mystical dialogue with the Lord: “Bene scripsisti de me, Thoma. Quam ergo mercedem accipies?” (“You have written well of me, Thomas. What reward do you want?”). And St. Thomas replied: “Non aliam nisi te, Domine.” (“Nothing but You, Lord.”)

ST. THOMAS AQUINAS CHURCH FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

SEPTEMBER 8, 2024 – REOPENING MASS

WHO DETERMINED THE NEW INTERIOR DESIGN?

The interior design was a collaboration of the Diocesan Office of Divine Worship – Father Paul Keller, O.P.; the architect – Willam Heyer; liturgical artist – Todd Brausch; and the pastor, Father David J. Young.

WERE THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS UPDATED AS PART OF THE PROJECT?

Yes. The stations were refurbished by T. Brausch Studios.

WAS ROSARY HALL INCLUDED IN THE RENOVATION?

Rosary Hall was included in the renovation; however, it will not be complete until October, 2024. In Rosary Hall, the lighting has been updated as well as a new drop ceiling.

ARE THERE ASPECTS OF THE PROJECT THAT DID NOT HAPPEN?

Yes. Due to budget limitations, there are aspects of the project that were not included. Hopefully, if there is a desire by the parish to fund additional projects, these can be addressed in the future.

DID THE DIOCESE CONTRIBUTE TOWARD THE REPAIR AND RENOVATION OF THE CHURCH?

The Diocese provided support from multiple offices including the Office of Divine Worship and the Diocesan Office of Facilities. The Diocese did not provide funding for the project. The funding has all been accomplished through St. Thomas Aquinas parish endowments, the generosity of parishioners contributing to the capital campaign, and also through charitable organizations such as the Cora E. Rogge Foundation.

IS THE LIGHTING DIFFERENT? THE CHURCH SEEMS SO MUCH BRIGHTER THAN BEFORE?

Yes, the lighting has been changed to a warm glow LED (Light Emitting Diode) lighting technology that provides a form of light that complements the interior design of the church. This type of lighting is also more energy efficiency and reduces electrical utilization by 70%.

HOW MUCH DID THE OVERALL PROJECT COST?

Approximately \$3 million.

DID THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COVER ALL THE COSTS?

The Capital Campaign did not cover all of the costs. The Capital Campaign is still over \$300,000.00 short of its goal. Other funds for the project were provided by the Cora E. Rogge Foundation, the City of Zanesville, and Endowments by parishioners of St. Thomas Aquinas Parish through their generosity for many generations.

MAY I STILL CONTRIBUTE TO THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN?

Yes. You can find envelopes for the capital campaign near each of the church entrances. Capital campaign envelopes are also situated at the entrances of the St. Thomas Aquinas Parish Activity Center, where the reception will be held, following the reopening Mass. My dear Parishioners,

It has been one thousand six-hundred fifty-six days since you have been able to have Mass in this beautiful, historic church of St. Thomas Aquinas. So much has happened in between that terribly difficult Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020 and today, September 8, 2024. You have a new bishop. You have new priests. A pandemic rumbled across our planet and has faded into dormancy (and hopefully, forever). Our world has changed. Our lives have changed. There have been many Baptisms, dozens of Confirmations, numerous First Communions, loads of Confessions, multiple Anointings of the Sick, hundreds of Masses, several Weddings, and you have even gotten to know a deacon who was ordained a priest (Fr. Michael Haemmerle), and a seminarian who was a newly-ordained deacon (Dcn. Sam Severance).

All of this is to say that the world did not stop turning on that February day, over four years ago. The Sacraments continued on, as did your faith. The sun rose and the sun set. The seasons came and went. The waters under the Y-Bridge have flowed and frozen and thawed and flowed freely again. Lots of what used to be cannot, or will not, be again. At the same time, much of what was *has* remained, steadfast and strong. What's exciting about today is that in the reopening of St. Thomas Aquinas, we celebrate **both**. We salute what has endured *and* we dedicate what has become new. That is what is at the heart of what we celebrate today. **Christ** is at the heart of what we do here today... and every day.

We begin a new era, here at St. Thomas Aquinas, with our heritage firmly rooted in the deep and lasting traditions and liturgies of our Catholic Faith. We start anew, here at St. Thomas Aquinas, as a family of faith, connected with our sister parish, St. Nicholas, while also honoring all of those families who first built this church, and this Catholic community, in Zanesville. That is what helps make this house of worship into a sanctuary of faith: our shared history, our shared identity, our shared connections and creed and community.

Most of all, what establishes this marvelous structure as a dear parish *home* is the centrality of, and communion with, our Lord Jesus Christ. Here, in the Holy Eucharist especially, we come together: to praise, to worship, to adore; to be taught with the Sacred Scriptures, and fed with the very Body and Blood of Christ; to remember, to pray, and to give thanks. And we do all of this as a family of faith, centered around Jesus Christ as our Sovereign, our Savior, and our Shepherd.

My dear parishioners, during the last Sunday Mass before this church would be closed in 2020, you heard proclaimed in the second reading that day, the following words from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians: "Brothers and Sisters: Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" You could not know at the time, but the Lord would soon ask you to hold that lesson in your hearts, through all of the ups and downs, the unknowns and the what-ifs, that were to come, with regard to your parish home.

But today, over fifteen hundred days later, you *have* held tight, indeed, in your dedication to the Lord, your devotion to our Catholic Faith, and your determined affection for this church: St. Thomas Aquinas, your home.

And so I say to you today: **Welcome Home!** It is a privilege and a blessing to celebrate with you, as your pastor, and to share this terrific moment with you all. In a special way, I want to thank three people who, with our good Lord, were instrumental in getting us to this happy occasion. Please join me in expressing deepest gratitude to Bishop Earl Fernandes, Father Jan Sullivan, and Mike Morris. Each one of these great men, in their own ways, have been indispensable in saving and restoring St. Thomas Aquinas Church. May Almighty God bless each of them for their perseverance, devotion, and enthusiasm in service to our Lord, His faithful, and this beloved parish church and community.

Let us always enter these doors with grateful hearts, and leave with souls that are fortified with grace and renewed by Love. May our good Lord continue to bless our parish, and the entire Catholic community of Zanesville.

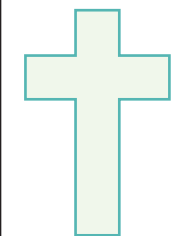
