PIVOTAL PLAYERS PREMIERE SESSION

St. Thomas Aquinas - The Theologian. The relationship of faith and reason is under intense scrutiny in an age beholden to the competing claims of fundamentalism and secularism. So-called “new atheists” insist that the claims of religion amount to mere superstition, a retrograde holdover from a time long ago. Others insist that the life of faith is a retreat into emotions and subjectivism. St. Thomas Aquinas anticipated these objections and trends and demonstrated that to believe is to think and that the life of the mind is integral to life in Christ.

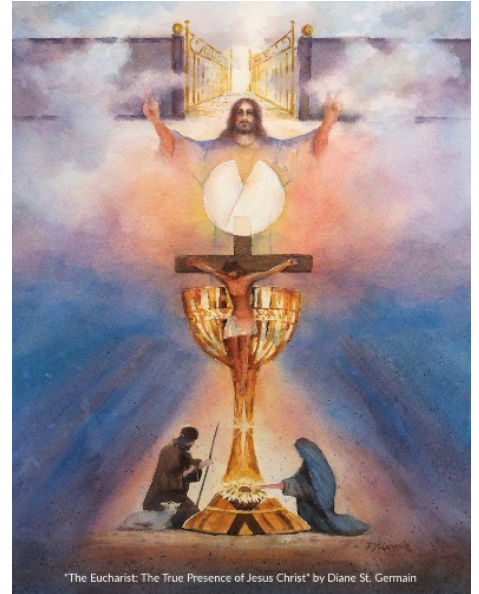

THE CHOSEN – SEASON ONE

Set in the 1st century Galilee, the first season chronicles how Jesus starts to build a group of disciples and His ministry. As He performs His first miracles, including turning water into wine in Cana, and invites people of various backgrounds to study under Him, Jesus calls the redeemed woman Mary Magdalene; the stonemason Thaddaeus; the choir member Little James; the fishermen Simon, Andrew, Big James, and John; the caterer Thomas and vintner Ramah; and the tax collector Matthew to follow Him. Following Jesus’s meeting with the Pharisee Nicodemus, the season culminates with the group traveling through Samaria, where Jesus launches public ministry after revealing to Photina, a Samaritan woman.

- 1 Pull your prior year return**
The form you'll need to review is **Ohio IT 1040**.



SAINTS OF THE DAY



Saint Timothy and Saint Titus

Saint of the Day: January 26

Patron Saints of Relief from Stomach Disorders

Timothy had a Greek father and a Jewish mother named Eunice. Being the product of a “mixed” marriage, he was considered illegitimate by the Jews. Timothy was a convert of Paul around the year 47 and later joined him in his apostolic work. He was with Paul at the founding of the Church in Corinth. During the 15 years he worked with Paul, he became one of his most faithful and trusted friends. He was sent on difficult missions by Paul – often in the face of great disturbance in local churches which Paul had founded.

Timothy was comparatively young for the work he was doing. Several references seem to indicate that he was timid. And one of Paul’s most frequently quoted lines was addressed to him: “Stop drinking only water, but have a little wine for the sake of your stomach and your frequent illnesses” (1 Timothy 5:23).

Titus has the distinction of being a close friend and disciple of Paul as well as a fellow missionary. He was Greek, apparently from Antioch. Even though Titus was a Gentile, Paul would not let him be forced to undergo circumcision at Jerusalem. Titus is seen as a peacemaker, administrator, great friend. Paul’s second letter to Corinth affords an insight into the depth of his friendship with Titus, and the great fellowship they had in preaching the Gospel.

When Paul was having trouble with the community at Corinth, Titus was the bearer of Paul’s severe letter and was successful in smoothing things out. Paul writes he was strengthened not only by the arrival of Titus but also “by the encouragement with which he was encouraged in regard to you, as he told us of your yearning, your lament, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced even more.... And his heart goes out to you all the more, as he remembers the obedience of all of you, when you received him with fear and trembling” (2 Corinthians 7:7a, 15).

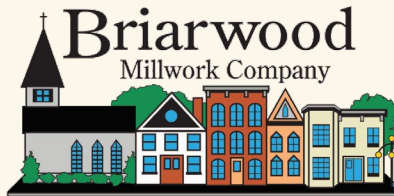
