PIVOTAL PLAYERS PREMIERE SESSION

St. Thomas Aquinas – The Theologian. The relationship of faith and reason is under intense scrutiny in an age beholden to the competing claims of fundamentalism and secularism. So-called “new atheists” insist that the claims of religion amount to mere superstition, a retrograde holdover from a time long ago. Others insist that the life of faith is a retreat into emotions and subjectivism. St. Thomas Aquinas anticipated these objections and trends and demonstrated that to believe is to think and that the life of the mind is integral to life in Christ.

THE CHOSEN – SEASONS 1 & 2

Set in 1st century Galilee, the first season chronicles how Jesus starts to build a group of disciples and His ministry. As He performs His first miracles, including turning water into wine in Cana, and invites people of various backgrounds to study under Him, Jesus calls the redeemed woman Mary Magdalene; the stonemason Thaddaeus; the choir member Little James; the fishermen Simon, Andrew, Big James, and John; the caterer Thomas and vintner Ramah; and the tax collector Matthew to follow Him. Following Jesus’s meeting with the Pharisee Nicodemus, the season culminates with the group traveling through Samaria, where Jesus launches public ministry after revealing to Photina, a Samaritan woman.

THE VATICAN NEWS FEED

We'd like to draw your attention to a new item on the Diocese of Columbus website (<https://columbuscatholic.org/>), the Vatican News Feed. Bishop Fernandes has worked with the Dicastery of Communications in Rome and the Catholic Foundation to be able to provide this free news service to the Diocese of Columbus. The Vatican feed is divided into three parts and will contain: 1) Videos constantly and automatically updated featuring Pope Leo XIV, 2) A news ticker about the pope, the Holy See, and the Universal Church, constantly and automatically updated, 3) The link to access Vatican.va, the official website of the Holy See with the pope's full texts. The feed features articles with reports on the pope and on the main events that take place in Rome and in the Universal Church, but also a number of materials that can be used for pastoral work, education, and prayer. This service will thus make it possible to strengthen the communion of American dioceses and parishes as well as all the diocese and parishes worldwide wide with the Successor of Peter, a pressing need especially today in the era of fake AI-generated content. The Vatican considers this initiative important and urgent also in view of the fact that the pontiff's mother tongue is English and, for the first time in history, the Pastor of the Universal Church is a citizen of the United States. You may have already noticed the feed on both the Diocese of Columbus and *The Catholic Times* websites.

SAINT CLEMENT MARY HOFBAUER

Saint of the Day: March 15

Patron Saint of Vienna and Warsaw

John was born in Moravia into a poor family, the ninth of 12 children. Although he longed to be a priest, there was no money for studies, and he was apprenticed to a baker. But God guided the young man's fortunes. He found work in the bakery of a monastery where he was allowed to attend classes in its Latin school. After the abbot there died, John tried the life of a hermit, but when Emperor Joseph II abolished hermitages, John again returned to Vienna and to baking.

One day after serving Mass at the Cathedral of St. Stephen, he called a carriage for two ladies waiting there in the rain. In their conversation they learned that he could not pursue his priestly studies because of a lack of funds. They generously offered to support both John and his friend Thaddeus, in their seminary studies. The two went to Rome, where they were drawn to Saint Alphonsus' vision of religious life and to the Redemptorists. The two young men were ordained together in 1785.

Newly professed at age 34, Saint Clement Mary Hofbauer, as he was now called, and Thaddeus were sent back to Vienna. But the religious difficulties there caused them to leave and continue north to Warsaw, Poland. They were active in social work among the poor, founding an orphanage and then a school for boys.

He quickly became "the apostle of Vienna," hearing the confessions of the rich and the poor, visiting the sick, acting as a counselor to the powerful, sharing his holiness with all in the city. His crowning work was the establishment of a Catholic college in his beloved city.

There were those in authority who were able for a while to stop him from preaching. Due to his efforts, the congregation was firmly established north of the Alps by the time of his death in 1820. Saint Clement Mary Hofbauer was canonized in 1909. His liturgical feast is celebrated on March 15.

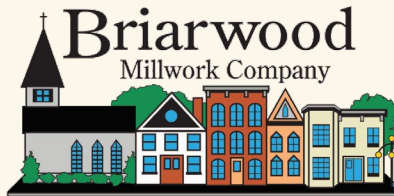

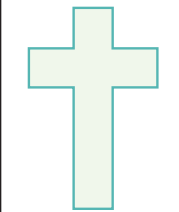
